MEMORY SEATS

Memory Seats allow you to set and recall your preferred position on more than just the driver seat. Adjust all of the possible seat positions and other adjustable features and save their settings for future recall. Once the settings are saved, they can be recalled at any time.



BENEFITS

Memory Seats are helpful because you:

- Won't have to adjust the seat, mirrors and steering wheel (if equipped) each time someone else adjusts it.
- Will save time and frustration of trying to find "that perfect spot" each time you use the vehicle.
- Can program an exit position for easy entry and exits from the vehicle.



How does the Memory Seats feature work?

- It allows you to save and recall your seat, steering wheel and outside mirror positions at the touch of a button.
- If the automatic recall is active through the Personalized settings in the Infotainment display, it will automatically recall settings based on the last used fob.



Why do I need this feature?

It takes the guesswork out of finding your comfortable driving spot again after someone else drives your vehicle. Once you set your preferred positions, you can recall all of them immediately.



How will I know which number to use?

Each key fob is assigned a number. On some vehicles, the Driver Information Center display will indicate the fob used when the ignition is turned on.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



How many settings are there?

In most vehicles there are two buttons you can use. That means you can save two sets of driver features. In some vehicles, there is also an "Exit" setting that can save a third position to provide additional room for you to exit the vehicle.



What if I want to change the settings once I set them?

You can change any or all of the settings at any time. To re-set anything, move what you like to a different position; then press and hold the memory seat button until you hear a beep. Press the associated setting number, either 1 or 2. The feature will beep twice.



In which types of situations would I find this feature most helpful?

After someone else drives your vehicle, you may discover the seat, mirrors and/or steering column positions have been changed. The memory seat returns all of your settings back to your saved position.


HOW IT WORKS

Memory Seats set and recall preferred positions of select driver features.

- With the ignition switched on to the accessory or run position, adjust all of the possible seat positions (e.g. cushion, backrest, lumbar), and, in many vehicles, other electronically controlled adjustable features (e.g. outside mirrors and steering column).
- Press the memory SET button and listen for a beep. Then, press button 1 or 2 to save all of the driver-preferred adjustments. The system will beep twice to confirm the settings were saved. If you did NOT hear two beeps, you may have not pressed 1 or 2 quick enough and you should repeat this step.
- Once the settings are saved, they can be recalled at any time by pressing and holding the memory seat button. In some instances, the memory seats can be programmed to recall automatically per the key fob whenever the driver's door is opened.

When another driver gets behind the wheel and changes any of the saved positions, the original settings can be recalled at the touch of a button. Drivers can:

- Recall their saved seating position by pressing and holding the appropriate button, either 1 or 2, until the seat returns to its previously set position.
- Over-write their saved positions to change any or all settings.
- In some vehicles, use the key fob to recall settings automatically, where all adjustments recall when the driver door opens
- Press the "Exit" button for that setting to recall when they want to exit the vehicle.
