Monitoring Requirements Not Met January 1, 2022 – June 30, 2022

The **Seven Estates** public water system **PWS ID TX1520188** has violated the monitoring and reporting requirements set by Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) in Chapter 30, Section 290, Subchapter F. Public water systems are required to collect and submit chemical samples of water provided to their customers, and report the results of those samples to the TCEQ on a regular basis.

We failed to monitor and/or report the following constitutes: Lead and Copper.

This/These violation(s) occurred in the monitoring period(s): January 1, 2022 – June 30 2022.

Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water is safe from chemical contamination. We did not complete all monitoring and/or reporting for chemical constituents, and therefore TCEQ cannot be sure of the safety of your drinking water during that time.

We are taking the following actions to address this issue:

This occurred before CSWR took ownership, and since then we have improved our quality control processes so that this does not occur again.

Please share this information with all the other people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (i.e., people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, and businesses).
