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Everything needed for this life's journey is already deep within. When I wake up in the morning, it's a brand-new day to become my ancestor's wildest dreams.

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In the U.S., the teen birth rate is approximately 17.4 births per 1,000 females aged 15-19. Only about 50% of teen mothers receive a high school diploma by age 22, compared to approximately 90% of women who did not give birth during adolescence—Moreover, less than 2% of teen mothers complete college by age 30. The economic and psychological impacts on teen moms can be profound. Teen mothers are more likely to live in poverty and depend on public assistance, facing significant educational barriers, discrimination, and threats to their health and well-being.

Brittany Ross, a former teen mom who overcame immense challenges after giving birth to twins at 17, is a testament to resilience and determination. She earned her bachelor's degree from Lindenwood University in 2009 and her master's in finance from Webster University in 2012. Today, Brittany serves as the Manager of Financial Operations at Central States Water Resources (CSWR) and is a recipient of the Women Who SPARK Award for Customer-Centric Innovation. Simultaneously, she is in the early stages of writing a book and building a nonprofit to support teen moms and parentless young people in the Metropolitan St. Louis area with their educational, personal, and professional goals. Brittany is an overall champion for equity and believes that providing equitable resources and opportunities to everyone positively moves our communities forward.

Her leadership extends to community projects like the **CSWR Cares** Committee where she served as Chair for 2023 and was instrumental in leading the creation of an Adopt a Classroom curriculum focused on water

education and responsibility for kids and partnerships with **Ronald** McDonald House and Operation Food Search. Brittany also actively participates in her sorority, Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc. where she has been a active Alumnae member for 14 years serving as chair of several partnership community campaigns throughout the years such as St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, March of Dimes, etc. She is a champion of community initiatives, emphasizing giving back and supporting others and a member of Women of Project Management, Women of Water and the National Association of Black Accountants. Brittany also is a supporter of Ready Readers which provides books to young children in low-income area to help them learn to read, she proudly sits on their Finance Board.











Notable Career Achievements

Brittany's outstanding contributions have earned her numerous accolades, including the <u>Women in Leadership honor by Focus St. Louis</u> (Cohort 78) and was part of the Inaugural Mentorship Program sponsored by the <u>United Way Women Leaders</u>. Her work has impacted the financial operations at CSWR but has also set a benchmark for customer-centric practices in the utility industry. Brittany has spent much of her career in the investor owned/privately held space and has created her own path forward.

Looking Ahead

As Brittany continues her professional journey, she is preparing for the Project Management Professional (PMP) certification, further solidifying her expertise in project management and next plans to sit for her Six Sigma Certification. She is also focused on spending more time with her family, particularly her children (two sets of twins), who are growing up fast. Brittany's book titled "Growing in Grace" will be an inspirational memoir offering a motivational mindset shift on using life's barriers as growing experiences rather than finding them as negative roadblocks. Her nonprofit, Reflections of Me, will center around the mental, financial, and emotional support of young teen mothers and parentless teens/young adults providing them resources, mentorship, and support villages that aid them in their plight to succeed in life.

Brittany Ross's story is a powerful testament to what we can achieve when we look past the limitations others may see in us and grasp what we know about ourselves. Commitment, dedication, and an innovative spirit are essential. Her work at CSWR not only exemplifies what customer-centric innovation looks like but also serves as an inspiration to others in the industry and beyond.
