

*****IMPORTANT INFROMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER***** Deer Springs (TX0270006) Burnet County, TX

Monitoring and Reporting Violation DLQOR Q3 2022 (July 1, 2022-September 30, 2022)

Deer Springs Water System PWS ID TX0270006, violated the monitoring and reporting requirements set by Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) in Chapter 30, Section 290, Subchapter F. Even though these were not emergencies, as our customers, you have the right to know what happened and what we are doing to correct this situation.

What happened?

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During Q3 2022, we did not monitor or test for DLQOR and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of your drinking water during that time. The table below lists the contaminants we did not properly test for and when we were supposed to sample for these contaminants.

What is being done?

Although CSWR-Texas had not yet acquired this water system from its previous owner, we have taken measures to hinder such missteps; we regularly monitor this parameter per TCEQ regulations to provide quality drinking water for our customers.

What should you do?

There is nothing you need to do. You do not need to boil your water or take any other corrective actions. If this had been an emergency, or if an emergency situation arises, you will be notified within 24 hours of the event and provided with directions to address the emergency.

Please share this information with all the other people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (i.e., people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, and businesses). You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.
